- WHEREAS, The National Insurance Crime Bureau encourages Kentuckians to get at least three written estimates when hiring a contractor, check contractor credentials, and work closely with insurers during the entire rebuilding process; and
- WHEREAS, The National Insurance Crime Bureau and its local and state partners in Kentucky, including law enforcement, first responders, legislators, and state officials, are committed to educating Kentuckians about predatory practices by dishonest contractors; and
- WHEREAS, The citizens of Kentucky are encouraged to become familiar with contractor fraud and participate in the various programs during the fifth annual Contractor Fraud Awareness Week, May 18-22, 2026;

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
